This week, I am in the process of filming twelve episodes of my "Stories on the Journey" series on Shalom World TV. As I told you some time ago, our friends from the Marian Order asked me to work with the Shalom World studios in helping them get their Chicago Office off the ground. I have based my twelve episodes (a "season" in their language) on those written in my books (see below) and my personal experience as a Catholic pastor. The folks at the studio tell me that they will need a month to produce the episodes I am taping this week (I taped three on Tuesday and will tape the other nine on Thursday-Friday). The shows will be broadcast on twelve consecutive weeks (starting in May), with the shows available on YouTube the day after broadcast. As soon as the episodes are available online, I will send them out to you and put them on our Parish and Facebook websites.


